

Whiteriver Unified School District Families In Transition (FIT) Program



The FIT program is supported by the McKinney-Vento Assistance Act (which is a federal law). It is a program for families who are in transition. It provides children and youth with supplies they need, such as, personal hygiene items, clothing for school or sleep/night clothes.

It also provides transportation services for students to their school of origin, if the parent/guardian requests for transportation assistance.





Any child/youth who is in transition cannot be denied enrollment if they do not have school records or other enrollment documents available, at the time of enrollment, or proof of residency is not available.

Who is considered homeless?

Anyone who, due to lack of housing, lives in emergency or transitional shelters, or motels, hotels, trailer parks, campgrounds, or abandoned buildings, or is doubled-up with relatives or friends because of economic hardships.

If you are in this situation, and your child/youth are currently enrolled in one of these schools:

- Seven-Mile Elementary School
- Whiteriver Elementary School
- Cradleboard Elementary School
- Canyon Day Junior High School
 - Alchesay High School



Contact the school your child/youth attends, and fill out the simple online form. The information will be given to the liaison, and she will enroll the student based on the criteria for the FIT program.

How do I enroll someone?



If your living situation changes, each school attendance clerk and health staff can help you with the online form. The form is then made available to the liaison to contact parents/guardians. The FIT program is to help children/youth succeed in school.
