Mid-Year Assessment Preview: Preparing for Success



As we approach the middle of our academic year, our students will soon participate in important mid-year assessments. These evaluations help us measure progress and ensure every child receives appropriate support. Here's what you should know:

How You Can Help at Home

As the cold weather sets in, it's especially important to maintain healthy routines and ensure your child is well-rested and prepared for the mid-year assessments. Staying healthy and focused during this season will help your child perform their best.

How We're Preparing at School

Our teachers are currently conducting targeted interventions with "bubble students" (those who need just a little extra support to reach proficiency). These small-group sessions focus on key skills and concepts that will be assessed.

What's Ahead

Additional intervention sessions will take place after we return from winter break.

One final round of focused support will be provided before the end-of-year testing.

- Ensure your child gets plenty of rest, especially the night before assessments
- Maintain regular attendance—every day of instruction matters
- Ask your child about what they're learning and have them explain concepts to you
- Create a quiet homework space free from distractions
- Communicate with teachers if you notice your child struggling with specific topics.

October Updates



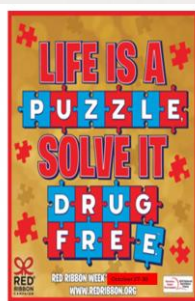
The Native American Day celebration was a wonderful success, bringing our community together to honor and learn about Native cultures.
