Fall Into Good Habits!

As we settle into the school year, September is the perfect time to strengthen the routines that help our Scouts succeed. **Good habits at home and at school work together!** When children know what to expect each day, they are better prepared to focus, learn, and become more independent.

Start the Day Ready to Learn

A successful school day actually begins the night before! Help your child establish a regular bedtime, prepare their clothes and backpack, and get plenty of rest. In the morning, arriving at school **on time and ready to learn** helps students start their day alongside their classmates without missing important instruction.

Every School Day Matters

Regular attendance is one of the most important habits we can build. Each school day brings new instruction, practice, conversations, and opportunities that can be difficult to replace. Unless your child is ill or there is an unavoidable circumstance, make **being at school every day and on time** a family priority.

Keep Learning Going at Home

Learning doesn't have to stop when the school day ends. Ask your child simple questions such as **"What did you learn today?" "What was challenging?"** or **"What are you proud of?"** Review papers that come home, practice math facts, read together, and encourage your child to tell you about what they are learning.

Build Independence

Encourage your child to take age-appropriate responsibility for their school routines. They can help pack their backpack, keep track of their belongings, complete assignments, and prepare for the next day. These small responsibilities help develop **organization, confidence, and independence.**

Celebrate Effort and Growth

Not every assignment or test will be perfect—and that's okay! Celebrate your child's **effort, improvement, perseverance, and willingness to keep trying.** A simple **"I'm proud of how hard you worked on that"** can help children understand that growth comes through practice and persistence. *(continue to next page)*

After reading, try asking:

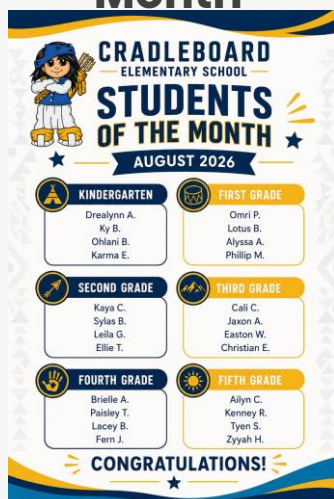
- What was your favorite part?

Meet Our Scout Leadership Council!



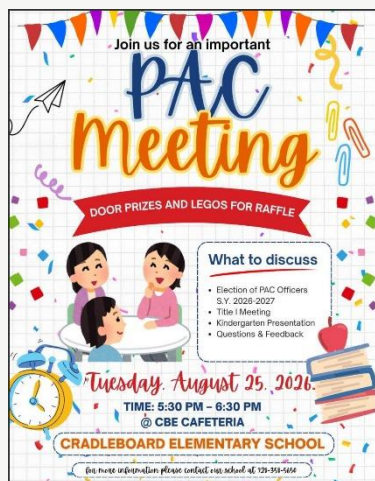
