Attendance/Truancy

It is the EXPECTATION that students attend school all day every day. Poor attendance is in violation of the WMAT Truancy CODE Resolution # 10-2019-203/ Ordinance # 295 and AZ State Law 15-801/15-808.

That means your student is here by 8:45 and stays until 3:45. Late arrivals and early checkouts are included in the truancy policy. Schedule doctor appointments for Fridays when possible. Excessive late arrivals and early checkouts disrupt classroom learning and may result in your child being retained. If there is a pattern of late arrivals/early checkouts, this can be grounds for a Truancy letter to be served.

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Rude vs. Mean vs. Bullying

Bullying, rude, mean...what's the difference? Don't they all mean the same thing? Not quite. Someone can be rude or mean without being a bully. Help us to help your child and you by having the following conversations with your students regarding good/bad choices, and knowing the difference between being rude, mean or being a Bully/bullied. Sometimes a person is rude or mean, not a bully. Remind your child to report so we can investigate.

- Report ANY concerns to the teachers or staff at school or on the bus. Often the children do not report it to the adults at school - children need to report so we can help.
- There are always 2 sides (sometimes more) to every story/incident. Once we are notified of a situation, we investigate, then proceed in an appropriate manner. We notify all parents/families of situations as they arise.
 - Often, it is a misunderstanding, or facts have gotten exaggerated from what really happened.

Rude vs. Mean vs. Bullying (cont.) Rude: saying or doing something

that hurts someone else, but NOT on purpose (ex:- poor manners, inconsiderate, wanting something to be 'their way', comments about other people's differences.)

Mean: saying or doing something that hurts someone else, ON purpose ONCE (ex:- saying you are fat/ugly, pushing someone off a swing because you wanted it, taking other people's things on

Bullying: intentional, aggressive behavior that happens OVER and OVER again, repeatedly over time, even when you tell them to stop or show them that you're upset (ex-EVERYDAY a child gets his money taken - if he doesn't give it up, he will get beat up.

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Ancillary Classes

PE - Mr. Henry

Welcome back to a new year of Physical Education at SME! I am excited to be your child's teacher and look forward to teaching your child the physical education/health standards that will help them become more confident, healthy, and safe. Some reminders for PE:

- Your student(s) gets 45-50 minutes (1 day) of PE per week. Please check with their teacher to know which day of the week your child has PE so they can dress accordingly (i.e.: We are not allowed to let a student sit out because they have new shoes that they do not want to get dirty). Please make us aware of any special situations with your child as they relate to PE on the participation form (i.e.; Asthma, injury, disability...).
- Clothing: Students need comfortable clothing that will allow them to move freely, jump, roll, throw, etc.... Girls who wear dresses are encouraged to wear shorts under their dress for modesty, and so they can confidently participate fully in the activity when the weather is hot, students should dress so that they do not overheat.
- Shoes: Shoes should be comfortable and allow them to run and stop (not slip) without falling. A sneaker type shoe is preferred. Students are not allowed to take their shoes off to participate in an activity. Please keep in mind that we have a large dirt field, red dirt softball/baseball diamond, and concrete basketball court. Shoes can get scuffed and marked up. On picture days, field trips, etc.... we will provide activities that allow them to dress up and still participate. Flip-flops are never allowed in PE. High heel shoes or shoes with slippery hard soles cause students to slip, fall, and turn ankles. Keeping your child safe and injury free is our first priority. We need your help by making sure they are properly dressed for physical activity. We do not like to sit a child out, but we would rather do that than risk your child being injured.

Computers - Ms. Efren

Kinder students will begin by properly holding a computer mouse. $1^{\rm st}$ and $2^{\rm nd}$ grade students will login to Clever and begin using MS Office, Kahoot, Kodable, and Code.org.

3rd-5th grade students will begin to build the foundation for correct typing technique by learning letter and basic punctuation keys, utilizing all ten fingers, and will gain an understanding of capitalization, punctuation, and number keys through practice and skill building.
